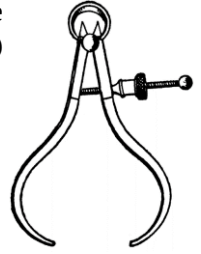

Advanced Manufacturing

CAD/CAM, G-Code and CNC

This course will introduce you to CAD/CAM applications, G-Code programming and hands-on CNC (Computer Numerical Control) operator skills. Training will focus on writing code, drawing and programming a part to given specifications, safe operation of CNC Milling and Turning Centers, and expose you to the use of standard setup sheets, tool lists, blueprints, inspection reports, and basic manufacturing processes.



You will utilize the Titans of CNC Academy resources to model and program your parts. You will be introduced to cutting tools, tool holders, speeds & feed calculations, work offsets and tool length offsets, and will machine parts to blueprint specifications and perform first article inspections. You will be expected to perform G-Code and CAD/CAM and homework assignments on your own personal computer. Computer experience and a basic understanding of manufacturing is necessary to be successful in this class.

Note: If you are interested in starting a career in advanced manufacturing or are currently employed in this profession, a \$445 scholarship may be available.

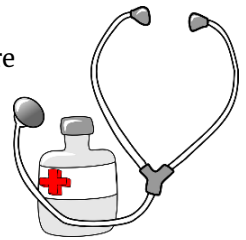

Allied Health

Clinical Medical Assistant

A clinical medical assistant is a multi-skilled allied health care professional that specializes in procedures commonly performed in the ambulatory health care setting. Medical assistants perform both clinical and administrative duties and assist a variety of providers including physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants. They typically work in medical offices, clinics, urgent care centers and may work in general medicine or specialty practice.



Many organizations are now offering career laddering opportunities for medical assistants with elevated responsibilities and pay. This course will prepare you to take the Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) exam accredited by the National Healthcareer Association.

There will be a \$155 fee when you take the CCMA exam.

Electronic Health Records Specialist

Are you interested in becoming a Certified Electronic Health Records Specialist? This course will prepare you to audit patient records for compliance, abstract clinical information for reports, perform basic coding to submit reimbursement claims, process Release of Information (ROI) requests for medical records, review patient records to ensure completion and accuracy, collect patient demographic and insurance information, discuss patient information with physicians and insurance professionals and provide you with the necessary knowledge and skills to take the Certified Electronic Health Records Specialist (CEHRS) exam accredited by the National Healthcareer Association.

There will be a \$117 fee when you take the CEHRS exam.

EKG Technician

EKG rhythms provide important data for the diagnosis of heart conditions. These tests can be performed during physical exams, when cardiovascular problems are suspected or in preparation for surgery. By administering EKGs (testing the electrical activity of the heart through small electrode patches attached to the body) you'll be making a life-changing difference by helping people of all ages prevent and treat heart disease. As a Certified EKG Technician, you'll have the credentials nearly all healthcare employers require to perform the critical tasks of administering EKGs, as well as Holter monitoring and stress testing. This course will provide you with the necessary knowledge and skills to take the national Certified EKG Technician exam accredited by the National Healthcareer Association.



There will be a \$117 fee when you take the CET exam.

Pharmacy Technician

Pharmacy Technicians are sought-after professionals in pharmacies located in hospitals, drug stores, doctors' offices and grocery stores. Most pharmacy employers seek applicants with a certification and many mandate it as a requirement.

This course will provide you with the necessary knowledge and skills to pass the national Pharmacy Technician Certification Exam® (PTCE®). Licensure with the MA Board of Registration in Pharmacy is required after passing the exam. Externship at CVS Health to be arranged between student and the pharmacy.



There will be a fee when you take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Exam®.

Phlebotomy Technician

Are you interested in becoming a Certified Phlebotomy Technician (CPT)? This course will prepare you for work in a laboratory or clinical setting, collecting blood for testing or donation, and provide you with the necessary knowledge and skills to take the CPT exam accredited by the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) during the last class. Phlebotomists are employed throughout the healthcare system including in hospitals, neighborhood health centers, medical group practices, HMO's, public health facilities, veteran hospitals, insurance carriers, and in other healthcare settings.

There will be a \$117 fee when you take the Certified Phlebotomy Technician exam.

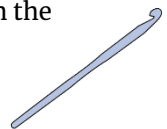

Arts and Crafts

Crochet

In this class, you will learn the basic crochet stitches and how to read simple patterns and complete projects. You will make a small Afghan with the stitches you learn. You will need to bring to class a skein of light colored 4 ply worsted weight yarn and a size "H" crochet hook.

Glass Flameworking – Ignite and Inspire

Flameworking uses heat and gravity to shape glass rods and tubes in the flame of a torch. You will learn various sculpting and glassblowing techniques using borosilicate glass. Beginners can sculpt pendants, flowers, marbles and human figures. Projects can advance to include glassblowing with tubing to make hollow forms such as ornaments or small vessels.

Demonstration, personal instruction and hours of hands-on torch time will be offered at your own pace. You are encouraged to come with ideas in mind or problems to solve. No experience is necessary. All levels are welcome and will be able to complete projects. Wear closed-toe shoes and natural fibers.

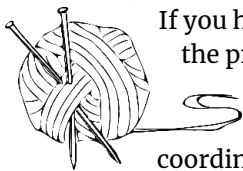

Knitting I



If you have never knitted, learned years ago and vaguely remember the process, only know the knit stitch and not the purl stitch or just need to build some confidence, this class is for you.

You will learn the following skills: comfort and coordination using knitting needles, cast on, bind off, knit stitch, purl stitch, gauge, reading knit patterns, recognizing and fixing mistakes and weaving in ends. You will start with two simple washcloths in cotton yarn and, if you advance quickly, there will be other projects available to learn new skills.

Knitting II

If you have already know how to knit and purl and you want to advance to the next step, then this is the class for you. You will learn the following skills: shaping (increases/decreases), working in the round, working to gauge, reading patterns and charts, and fixing mistakes. More experienced students may be ready to learn textural stitches, cables, lace, or color techniques. You will work at your own pace on your own project based on your own individual level. For students who don't know much beyond knit and purl, the first project will be a knitted envelope in acrylic and then a wool hat. For students with more experience, there will be several cowl patterns to choose from that have varying degrees of difficulty and highlight different techniques.

Make Furniture – 3D Design for Laser Cutting

This workshop will guide you through designing, laser cutting, and assembling a beautiful and functional display shelf to take home*. We will cover the basics of parametric design workflow in Autodesk Fusion 360 and learn how to convert our 3D model into 2D files to be used with a laser cutter. Each class will provide an immersive hands-on experience.

Classes 1 – 2: Mini Shelf

Learn the basics of the Fusion 360 to laser cutter workflow in order to create a 3-piece shelf that will fit on your hand.

Classes 3 – 4: Tabletop Bookcase

Dig deeper into Fusion 360's tools in order to increase your model's size, add more parts, improve its structural stability, and customize it to your liking.

Classes 5 – 6: Assembly and Decoration

Laser cut and assemble your bookcase, and learn how to use the laser to engrave designs to beautify your new piece of furniture!

Note: Each student will be responsible for bringing in their own 24" x 48" sheet of plywood for their final product.

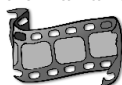

Photography I

This course is for the beginner to digital photography.

Although Photo I is geared to the digital format, those with traditional (film) cameras will also benefit from this class. We will discuss and learn the total photographic process and about the camera and how it functions. Shutter speed, f-stops, ISO and their relationship to each other will be thoroughly explained. You will learn about white balance, composition and lenses.



Photography II

This course is an extension of Photography I. Although Photography I is not required, a good knowledge of your camera is essential to benefit fully from this class. The student should have a knowledge of ISO, f-stops, shutter speed, depth of field and basic composition, although a quick review will be given in class. A digital SLR or film SLR will greatly enhance your learning experience. We will fine tune our understanding of depth of field, composition and flash techniques.

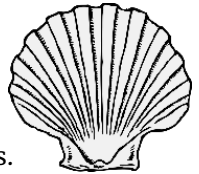

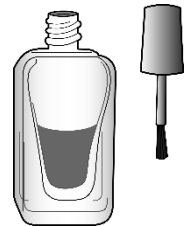

Are you ready for a career as a Nail Technician? This course will prepare you for the Massachusetts Manicuring License Exam. In all states, except Connecticut, nail technicians must hold a valid state license in order to practice legally. Some states, like California, require as much as 600 hours of training through a nail technician program, while other states, like Massachusetts, require as little as 100 hours of training. After completing the program, nail technicians must take written and practical exams to get a license through their state board.

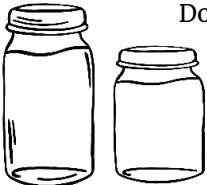

Electrical

Journeyman and Systems Technician Code and Theory

Would you like to become a licensed electrician? According to the Massachusetts State Board of Electrical Examiners, before you take the

Journeyman licensing exam you must complete:

- 8000 hours of employment (approximately 4 years) as an apprentice under the direct supervision of a holder of a MA Class B Journeyman's license and
- 600 hours of classroom instruction (8 modules – approximately 75 hours each) in electrical code and theory from an approved school based on the current National Electrical Code; and before you take the

Systems Technician licensing exam you must complete:

- 4000 hours of employment (approximately 2 years) as an apprentice under the direct supervision of a holder of a MA Class B Journeyman's license and
- 300 hours of classroom instruction (4 modules – approximately 75 hours each) in electrical code and theory from an approved school based on the current National Electrical Code;

There is no set order for the two requirements listed above. You may start working as an electrical apprentice first, start classes first, or do both concurrently. All students must bring a current MA Electrical Code Book to all classes.

Municipal Wastewater Treatment

Prepare to take the Massachusetts Municipal Wastewater Grade 1-4 Certification Exam. This course will provide an overview of the basic steps taken in treating wastewater such as preliminary, primary, biological and tertiary treatment. It will also cover functions of equipment and support systems as well as environmental responsibilities required to safely and properly operate a wastewater treatment facility. We will visit a local wastewater treatment plant and meet individuals within the wastewater industry.

Plumbing

Journeyman and Master Code and Theory

Would you like to become a licensed plumber? In Massachusetts, a hopeful plumber begins a 5 year apprenticeship program to receive technical education and complete the required hours of on-the-job training under a licensed master plumber. Plumbers who have successfully completed their apprenticeship are known as journeymen.

To work independently, a plumber is required to receive a license. An applicant will not receive credit for work experience and education unless they were completed in conjunction with one another as measured by calendar years. For each year in which an apprentice obtains 110 clock hours of education, that apprentice must accrue 1700 clock hours of qualifying work experience with some exceptions:

- An unlicensed individual may complete Tier 1 of the education requirement prior to obtaining an apprentice license.
- A licensed apprentice may complete Tier 1 and Tier 2 in a single calendar year.
- In the event that an apprentice is enrolled in a tier but loses their employment, they shall be permitted to complete the tier they are enrolled in.

Veterinary

Blood Film Evaluation for the Veterinary Technician

A Complete Blood Count (CBC) requires microscopic evaluation of a blood film by a properly trained member of the veterinary care team. Creating diagnostic blood slides can sometimes be frustrating, but with a few tips – along with some practice – you can quickly become an expert. This two-hour lab will begin with proper sampling handling, slide prep, and use of the microscope. We will focus much of our time recognizing normal and abnormal morphology of erythrocytes, leukocytes and platelets. We will also discuss methods for estimation and differentiation of each of these blood components. We will be using canine and feline blood samples to walk through this process step by step.

Urinalysis for the Veterinary Technician

Performing a complete urinalysis is an essential task of a veterinary technician and consists of four main parts: gross examination of the urine, the reagent test strip, the specific gravity and microscopic examination of the urine sediment. This 2-hour wet lab will begin with proper sample procurement and handling and then spend the majority of the time on the four components of analysis. We will use feline and canine samples for microscopic evaluation with a focus on differentiating structures commonly found in urine.
